Potholes patched in EMR

Ministry of Works PS updates media on capital works projects progress

Traffic in Eight Mile Rock came to a crawl yesterday – Thursday, October 4 – morning as employees from Waugh Construction continued to solve what residents say, is the long awaited “patching” of their pothole problem.

Parliamentary Secretary in the Ministry of Public Works Additionally, Iram Lewis, Member of Parliament for Central Grand Bahama was on hand to oversee the work, as promised in an update during an interview on Sunday, September 30 at the Office of the Prime Minister.

The Ministry of Public Works partnered with the local construction company to address the vexing problem.

Lewis noted that during a recent visit by the Minister of Public Works, Desmond Bannister, to Grand Bahama last week he pointed out the “terrible” conditions of many of the roadways on the island, particularly in the outlying areas.

He disclosed that talks are underway to rectify some of the issues with respect to the roadways, as residents were complaining bitterly. “As a part of (Continued on Page 3)

Recruits encouraged to reach their full potential

ACP Butler inspects new RBPF recruits during early morning drill exercise

Assistant Commissioner of Police (ACP) Samuel Butler encouraged the 34 new Royal Bahamas Police Force (RBPF) Grand Bahama recruits to use their law enforcement career to reach their full potential.

ACP Butler, Officer-in-Charge of the Northern Bahamas shared the advice with the new recruits Wednesday (October 3) morning, during an inspection and drill exercise at the Police Training College.

ACP Butler told the recruits to be a, “more person. Think more, find quiet spaces to think. I want you to be a more person, by reading more ... there’s no lim-

it in reading. I want you to become a more person by knowing more, by observing the world around you and being in tuned with it.”

He added that the RBPF is a great place to start. “You’re getting a whole lot out of this training, something that many of your peers would not have an opportunity to do.”

ACP Butler advised them to use their training to be more of service to the wider community.

He also encouraged the recruits to seek to have more and seek to be more. “Never give up on developing.”

Following his address, ACP Butler stated that the exercise was a general inspection to check on the recruits.
