No Widesnreau firings by the govť

DPM: OUR SALARY BILL HAS GROWN BY SOME \$15 MILLION, DRIVEN PRIMARILY BY PAYMENT OF OVERTIME

Deputy Prime Minister Peter Turnquest, Minister of Finance said that despite what the official political opposition may wish to portray to the Bahamian people, there has been no widespread firings by the present government.

Turnquest's comments came during his 2017/2018 Mid-term Budget Statement, where he offered a detailed breakdown to his colleagues on Wednesday, March 7.

"Mr. Speaker, in my Mid-term

Statement two weeks ago, I pointed out that our salary bill had grown by some \$15 million, driven primarily by payment of overtime due to police and payments arising from the fulfilment of public sector industrial agree-

"Some critics, including those who ought to know better have made a host of claims regarding this government engaging in a massive retrenchment of public sector staff; essentially that we have fired thousands of Bahami-

However, he noted that the reality of it all tells a different story. "It speaks to what the former

administration was really doing with the people's money in the lead up to the election.

"During the last fiscal year, government records indicate that

Violence and injury running up the cost of health care

Minister of Health, Dr. Duane Sands said there is a growing concern of violence and injury running up the cost of health care and crippling the country's social systems.

"We must get a handle on the root causes of this with research guiding our understanding of this growing epidemic," Dr. Sands said at the Medical Association of The Bahamas' 46th Annual Scientific Conference held at Melia Nassau Beach resort, March 7, 2018.

He said however, that the conference aims to celebrate the country's achievements in health care and the vision of a better health care system in The Bahamas for all, that is efficient, cost effective and that provides value for money, along with being accountable and equitable.

"We have achieved significant legislation over the past two years governing stem cell research and registration and licensing of physicians.

"This deserves recognition as we are leading the way in our Region. The future looks bright. We stand on the shoulders that come before us."

Dr. Sands explained that at this time in the nation's health history, there is a very large number of physicians who have successfully completed their education, and credit should be given to the government of The Bahamas and the staff of the University of

the West Indies.

"I have been advised that there will be 75 medical students graduating and who will be applying for internships in The Bahamas. There is also a very large number of physician staff not enrolled in post-graduate programmes, yet
